

Financial Results






Customer Results

2023 Total People Served






During 2023, 13% of the students who attended the School of Bright Promise transitioned back to a less restrictive environment in their local school district.

Service Results

To better serve individuals and families with developmental disabilities the JCBDD focused on locating resources to meet the needs of the people served. The key statistics for 2023 are listed below.



JCBDD served 168 individuals on Medicaid Waivers in 2023. The County Board has prioritized the independence of those it serves by boosting waiver funding. This increase focused on supportive/remote technology, environmental modifications, and adaptive/assistive equipment. The funding saw a significant rise of 281% from 2022 to 2023.



JCBDD increased the number of Private Providers by 2% from 2022 to 2023 with a total of 42 Private Providers.




JCBDD increased the number of people served in the community employment department by 16% from 2022 to 2023 with a total number of 72 people.



JCBDD assisted in state funding totaling \$381,833 in order to improve housing and better support people with residential needs.
